Economic data for December again presented mixed signals for the Commonwealth:

- Nationally, inflation rose 0.2%, while Pennsylvania's bi-monthly reading showed a 0.1% drop.
- Electricity and natural gas prices continued to increase, while gasoline remained stable.
- Pennsylvania's unemployment rate rose 0.1% for the second consecutive month and stands at 3.6%. Nationally, unemployment dropped 0.1% to 4.1%, however, it remains 0.3% higher than this point last year.
- Pennsylvania continues to hold a better unemployment rate than New Jersey, New York, Ohio, West Virginia, and Delaware, while running slightly higher than Maryland.


