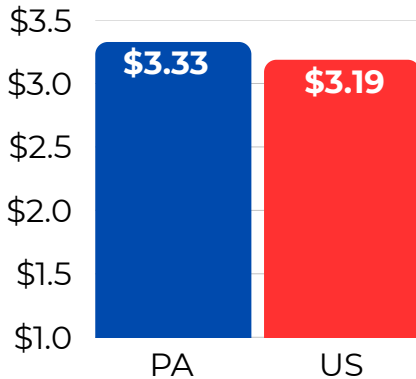
Economic data for June showed mix signals for Pennsylvania:

- Pennsylvania's bi-monthly inflation rate rose 40 basis points to 3.3%.
- Nationally, inflation increased by 30 basis points over the prior month to 2.7%.
- Pennsylvania's unemployment rate increased slightly to 4.0% while the national unemployment rate dropped to 4.1%.
- Pennsylvania reported a lower unemployment rate than New Jersey and Ohio, a higher rate than Maryland and West Virginia, and the same rate as Delaware and New York.
- Gasoline prices in Pennsylvania (\$3.33/gal) were 14 cents above the national average.



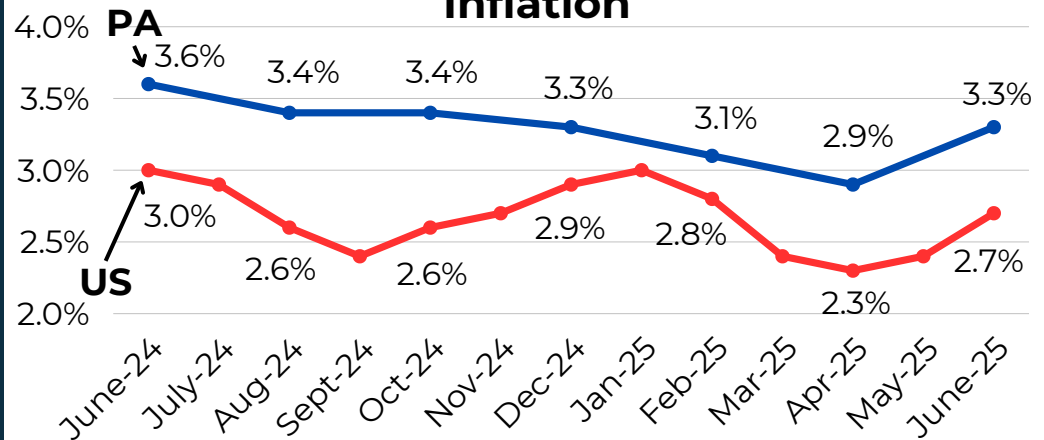
Gas Prices
